• OUR SCHOOL <

Welcome to the 1st Primary School of Rafina. It is one of the 4 schools in our area and was built in
1978 in the center of town. It is painted gray with light green and shares its premises with the 4th Primary School of Rafina.



To explore it, you must first choose one of its 3 entrances. It is impossible not to be impressed by its external beauty when you come across the spacious courtyard, which has a basketball court, a volleyball court and a well-kept aquaponic garden with different types of plants and fishes. In one corner there is the canteen and near it the water taps.









Entering the building, the first thing we see are the classes of the youngest children, the offices of the teachers, the office of the principal and our newly renovated toilets. Next to the classrooms we also find the event hall, which is used mainly in winter for physical education classes, official events and as a venue for all-day activities. Directly next to the halls is also our small, fine storage room, where we can store all the things we need for the sports lessons.







A little further from the classrooms of the younger children is the corridor with the marble-covered staircase leading to the second floor. There we find the older children's classes, which are quite large and all equipped with projectors for more modern and easier learning. To the left of the classes is our small library, painted with happy colors. We can borrow books from the library so that we can practice reading. In the middle of the corridor is the computer room which has 14 computers so we spend our time learning more about them. On the right side of the corridor we find the class where foreign children take special Greek lessons.





Looking out the large windows of the classrooms, we also see the second two-story building of our school, which has colorful and spacious classes for young, as well as for slightly older children. On the first floor are the classrooms, a small storage room and the toilets, while the second floor houses the physics workshop and our aquaponics system.



School Time Schedule

School is open Monday through Friday from 8. 3 pm to 4 pm. Morning school is compulsory and is divided into six teaching hours.

The first break lasts 20 minutes from 9.40am to 10.00am. The second break lasts 15 minutes from 11:30 a.m.

to 11.45am, while the third break lasts ten minutes from 12.25pm to 12.35pm. At the end of the last lesson, at 1.15pm, children who do not attend the optional all-day school go home. This is followed by the optional all-day program, which is divided into three (3) periods with two fifteen-minute breaks between 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. Students in the full-day program have the option of leaving at 3:00

p.m.

- The Acropolis Museum
- The Acropolis Museum is an archaeological museum that focuses on the finds of the archaeological site of the Acropolis of Athens. The museum was built to house all the objects found on the sacred rock of the Acropolis and at its foot, covering a wide period from the Mycenaean period to the Roman period and Paleo-Christian Athens.

- The Athens Concert Hall
- The Athens Concert Hall, better known as Concert Hall or Megaron, is a venue for musical and cultural events and conferences. Its building is located in Athens at Vasilissis Sofia Avenue and its official opening took place on March 20, 1991. It is considered one of the most famous venues of its kind in the world for both classical and traditional Greek music. Every year, the Concert Hall organizes a total of about 500 events, such as performances of classical music, opera, theater, dance, etc.



Excursions we take

The National Archaeological Museum of Greece is one of the most important museums in the world in the field of Ancient Art. Its collections represent all cultures that flourished in the Greek area from prehistoric times to the end of the Roman period.

The museum is located in Athens, on Patision Street and next to the historic building complex of the National Technical University of Athens.
